

**HELP & SHELTER
WOMEN'S WORLD OF PRAYER GERMAN COMMITTEE PROJECT
EVALUATION OF FOLLOW-UP PEER EDUCATORS' WORKSHOPS
NOVEMBER 2010**

Four 2-day Follow Up Workshops were held targeting residents from project and adjoining communities in November 2010.

Kaneville/Diamond/Grove

Attendance

A total of 10 persons attended the workshop; of these 7/70% were females and 3/30% males. The age range of participants was between 14-45, with 40%, 14-16 years, 40%, 30-39 and 20%, 40-49 years old.

Participants' Evaluation

A total of 8 evaluation forms were filled out and returned by participants. All of the participants, 100% said they definitely understood the information presented, learnt new ideas and skills, increased their knowledge and understanding of facilitation, peer education, the role and skills of the facilitator and work and qualities of peer educators. Additionally all of the participants also increased their understanding and knowledge of healthy/unhealthy relationships, child abuse and types of child abuse. Participants also agreed that the workshop was successful in promoting positive action to reduce DV and GBV, thought their plan of action was good and would support its implementation and liked the way in which the workshop was facilitated. Venue, arrangements and food were assessed as definitely good and handouts found to be both useful and informative. The majority of participants, 75% also felt that there was enough time given for group work and the sharing of information.

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Peer Educator’s Activities

A total of 4 groups planned and completed the following activities in the month of November:

- Awareness session on Domestic Violence with 7 female parents from Grove Nursery School between the ages of 21-36
- Awareness Talk on Child Physical Abuse with 8 students, 4 females and 4 males from Friendship Secondary School
- Awareness session on Physical and Emotional Abuse with 10 women from the Full Gospel Church
- Awareness session on Self with 4 parents from Grove Nursery School
- Awareness sessions on GBV with Form 1 students of IPE
- Awareness sessions on Domestic violence and Self with Form 2 students from IPE

What participants found most useful about the workshop

- Most useful was the information received from the facilitators
- Information given was useful especially personal experiences shared and testimonies of how persons overcame different types of abuse
- Learning how to deal with person in situations of abuse
- Learning what neglect and abuse is was most helpful
- Learning new skills

What participants found least useful about the workshop

- Participants did not identify anything that was not useful

Participants’ suggestions for improving the workshop

- Workshops to be held more often in order to enlighten us peer educators to new information
- We need more people e.g. fathers and more school children attending workshops
- Getting flyers, cardboard, paper markers and tape to continue the work

Den Amstel

Attendance

A total of 12 persons attended the workshop; of these 7/58% were females and 5/42% males. The age range of participants was between 14-20, with 83%, 14-16 years and 8%, 20-29 and 29 years old.

Participants’ Evaluation

A total of 11 evaluation forms were filled out and returned by participants. All of the participants, 100% said they definitely understood the information presented, learnt new ideas and skills, increased their knowledge and understanding of facilitation , peer education , the role and skills of the facilitator and work and qualities of peer educators. Additionally all of the participants also increased their understanding and knowledge of healthy/unhealthy relationships, child abuse and types of child abuse. Participants also agreed that the workshop was successful in promoting positive action to reduce DV and GBV, thought their plan of action was good and would support its implementation and liked the way in which the workshop was facilitated and felt there was enough time for group work and sharing of information. Venue, arrangements and food were assessed as definitely good and handouts found to be both useful and informative by all of the participants.

Peer Educator's Activities

A total of 4 groups planned and completed the following activities in the month of November:

- Awareness session on Anger Management with 18 students 6 females and 12 males of Den Amstel Primary School between the ages of 10-11
- Awareness session on Child Neglect with 35 Form 1` students, 22 females and 13 males between the ages of 11-12
- Awareness session with 40 students, 20 females and 20 males from Forms 2 & 3 on Form of Violence

What participants found most useful about the workshop

- Awareness talk on sexual abuse with 10 youth, 6 females and 4 males and distribution of handouts on sexual abuse
