Naming of at least 3 things that participants will do differently as a result of the workshop:

- Adhere to the provisions in the new SOA, report abuse and educate others
- Make wise choices especially about sexual offences and DV
- Watch what I say to females
- Refrain from being involved in DV, not to be involved in any sexual offences which is against the Laws that govern our society today
- Try to prevent DV and sexual violence
- be more careful with what I am doing, take action in my relationship
- I will stop abusing my boyfriend
- Continue to read up on gender roles, DV and sexual offences
- Won't verbally abuse others, change my attitude and behaviour towards people who have been abused and watch my sexual conduct
- Will not expose genitals, or engage in voyeurism or rape
